10. What choice did God give His people? (Deuteronomy 30:11–20)

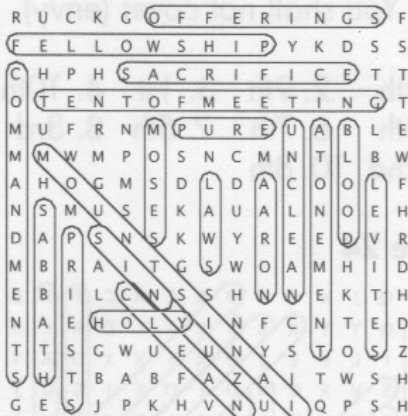

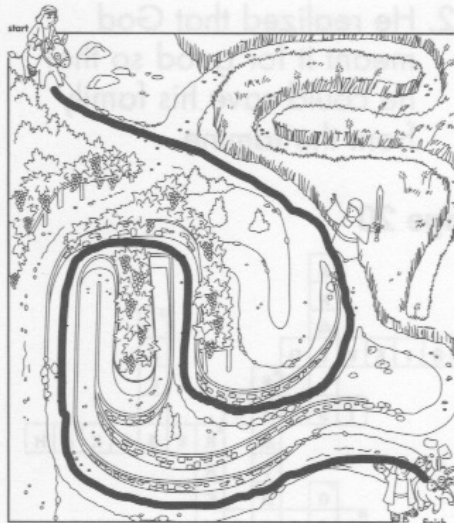

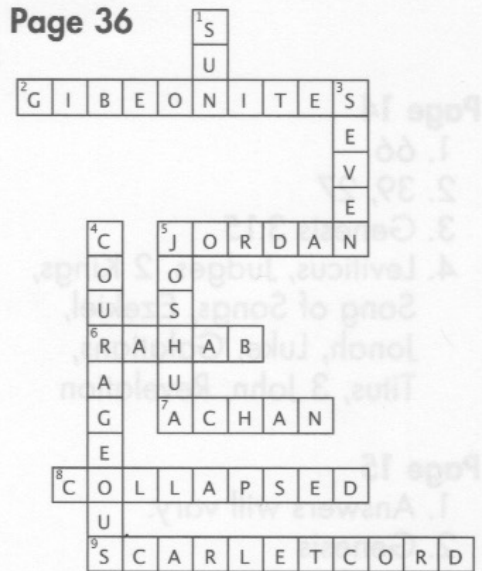
